A key part of our mandate is community economic development. We often work alongside community leaders and stakeholders to create plans and implement projects that support the 'big picture' such as business retention and succession planning strategies.

One of our ongoing initiatives is the regional Economic Development Alliance: The alliance is made up of economic developers representing all municipalities in our region, that meet bi-monthly to share information and partner on projects. Many partnerships have developed from this alliance and have complemented our long standing partnership with Lanark County.

By way of a Service Agreement, Valley Heartland provides economic development services to Lanark County, and has recently completed a county-wide collaborative economic development strategic planning process. The process was led by Valley Heartland, Lanark County and OMAFRA, and was driven by:
