CONTRACT

Contract between International Christian School of Uijeongbu, Students, and Parents

International Christian School of Uijeongbu(ICSU) is guided by a philosophy, a set of ethics and a worldview that come from a Christian perspective. The school seeks to provide an environment and program that promotes good character, academic advancement and physical, emotional, and spiritual growth in each student. Realizing that successful child development comes from mutual participation and cooperation of the school personnel and parents, every effort will be made to keep lines of communication open. It is to be clearly understood that students in ICSU will be exposed to the teachings and practices of Christianity.

By signing this contract, the parents of _____ enroll their child in ICSU and acknowledge that they have read and agree with and will abide by the policies set forth in the Parent Student Handbook and agree to the following:

1. Students and parents will do all in their power to protect the good name of the school, its equipment, buildings, and property. Vandalism will be repaired and paid for by the students involved.
2. Students will maintain standards of courtesy, kindness, morality, and honesty. Students will refrain from swearing, possessing or using tobacco, alcohol or illegal drugs, dishonesty and indecent, disorderly conversation and behavior on or around the campus or during school activities, including bus transportation to and from school. The school has the authority to search lockers, backpacks, and any student on the school campus at any time. ICSU has the authority to suspend or dismiss a student from school when the student has committed an act of gross misconduct or has engaged in persistent disobedience. In addition, school officials shall deal (suspension or dismissal) with any public behavior outside of school, which harms or discredits the good name of the school.
3. All students enter the school on a nine week probation period. Students who after this first nine weeks have under a 2.0 GPA or is performing below grade level standards will be



placed on Academic Probation and may be dismissed after the first semester if they do not improve their grades enough to be removed from Academic Probation.

4. Parents will support the school's academic program by encouraging appropriate study habits and ensuring consistent homework completion by the students. Students on Academic Probation for two consecutive semesters will not be eligible for tuition assistance under the school's Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) the following semester. A student who is removed from eligibility from TAP may reapply after completion of two consecutive semesters of successful academic work and exemplary behavior. Students remaining on Academic Probation for more than three semesters may be dismissed at the end of the third semester.
5. Parents will support the school's uniform policy and buy enough uniforms to have their children in uniform each day. The parents and children are aware of the consequences of not being in uniform as stated in the Parent Student Handbook.
6. Students will show respect to the Christian standards and philosophy which govern ICSU. Any student who acts disrespectfully or exhibits a disrespectful attitude towards Christ and His Word will be warned about his / her behavior. If this attitude continues he / she will be dismissed.
7. Parents will support the discipline policies of the school, entrusting the faculty to implement disciplinary measures, in order to build character in the children and an atmosphere conducive to learning in the classroom. There is an extra fee for after school detentions depending on the number of detentions the students has had.. ICSU reserves the right to include discipline items on the student's transcript.
8. Parents agree to cooperate fully in making tuition payments as arranged with the school; the school will notify the parents in writing upon failure to pay delinquent accounts. Accounts more than 30 days delinquent may result in suspension of the student until suitable arrangements have been made to bring the account current. No records will be given to families who are delinquent in their payments.
9. Parents will ensure that students will arrive on time to school and will avoid unnecessary absences or family trips during the school year. Visa trips are understandable but family vacations are not.
10. Upon early withdrawal from ICSU, tuition (fees are non-refundable) – 14 day prior notice required - official withdrawal date will be 14 days from the date of notification. Month of withdrawal - No refund of tuition, transportation, lunch, or EFL for the month of

withdrawal. Months following withdrawal - 100% refund of tuition, transportation, lunch, and EFL. All other fees are non-refundable.

- 11. Parents agree to uphold the rules and regulations of the school and will bring any matter of disagreement to the school administration, never discrediting the school before the students or others. This includes athletic practices and games.

- 12. Parents absolve International Christian School of Uijeongbu from any liability to his / her child because of any injury to the child at school or during any school-related activity with the understanding that the parents maintain accident insurance or medical coverage on the child.

- 13. We understand that our child’s likeness may be photographed or videotaped by the school in the course of school activities. We hereby give consent for the school to use our child’s likeness on the school website, in promotional, and/or advertising materials.

SECONDARY CHEATING POLICY

Description of Cheating: Cheating can be defined in more than one way. The following list is comprised of what ICSU identifies as cheating. It may not be conclusive; each case is determined by ICSU Administration.

- If a student receives or gives out information about a test or quiz to students who have not taken the quiz or test, this is cheating.
- Looking at someone else’s paper, quiz, or test is cheating.
- Copying someone else’s homework is cheating.
- Students are generally not permitted to speak or whisper or communicate in any fashion while a quiz or test is being administered. Students who do this are violating school policy and will be punished for cheating. This is true even if a student has turned in his/her test paper.
- Having notes hidden in their desk and glancing at them during a quiz or test is cheating.
- Glancing at notes or hidden test material anywhere it is placed while taking a test is cheating.
- Giving another student their homework or doing someone else’s homework is cheating.
- Sending/receiving text messages during a test/quiz is cheating, as well as a phone policy violation.
- Using a laptop for online tests must adhere to proper procedures, including but not limited to, accessing additional web pages or documents, accessing other web browser tabs, using any electronic resources that would violate the intent and purpose of the assessment.
- Plagiarism will not be permitted. Plagiarism is the practice of taking someone else’s work or ideas and passing them off as one’s own.
- Copying information from the Internet without giving credit to the source.

The Bible speaks against being untruthful and tells mankind to walk in such ways as to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ. Students are taught at ICSU to develop their integrity and honesty between themselves, other students, teachers, and God. When cheating occurs, in any manner, there will be stern disciplinary action taken.

Students caught cheating will be given an “F” on the paper, quiz, test, etc. and an In School Suspension (ISS). Students allowing someone else to copy their answers or work, not already authorized by the teacher, will also receive an “F” and an ISS. The student may be expelled from ICSU if cheating continues.

STUDENT TECHNOLOGY AGREEMENT

ACCEPTABLE USE OF TECHNOLOGY & INTERNET POLICY

ICSU is pleased to offer its students access to the Internet through desktop computers, iPads, Chromebooks, and wirelessly for their mobile devices. The purpose of school provided Internet access is to facilitate communications in support of research, creativity, and education. To remain eligible as users, students' use must be in support of and consistent with the educational objectives of ICSU.

Students utilizing school provided Internet access must have the permission of and must be supervised by the school's professional staff. Students are responsible for good behavior online just as they are in a classroom or other areas of the school. The same general guidelines regarding respect of others in both behavior and communications apply.

The Internet has many educational benefits for students, like connecting them to resources from distant computers, communicate and collaborate with other individuals and groups around the world, and significantly expand their available information base. Unfortunately, there are risks involved with using these resources. Students, whether they are accessing the Internet on campus or away, need to be vigilant and protect their personal safety, by not giving out personal information to others on forums, bulletin boards, chat lines, etc. ICSU has systems in place to block most objectionable Internet content from students. ICSU cannot guarantee that users will not encounter text, pictures or references that are objectionable. Access is a privilege, not a right. Access entails responsibility.

ACCEPTABLE USE OF TECHNOLOGY: School Computers and Internet

This Acceptable Use Policy applies to both ICSU computers and on student-owned computers (laptops, tablets, phones, etc.).

Students enrolled at ICSU will have accounts to access the school's information technology resources. Students that graduate or withdraw from ICSU will have their accounts suspended 30 days after the date of withdrawal. The school's information technology resources, including email, web tools, SIS (PowerSchool), LMS (Schoology), Intranet, and Internet access, are provided for educational purposes. Adherence to the following policy is necessary for continued access to the school's technological resources.

Users should not expect that files and messages stored on school based computers will be private. Electronic messages and files stored on school based computers may be treated like school lockers. Administrators and faculty may review files and messages to maintain system integrity and insure that users are acting responsibly.

ICSU makes no warranties of any kind, expressed or implied, for the Internet access it is providing. ICSU will not be responsible for any damages users suffer, including, but not limited to, loss of data resulting from delays or interruptions in service. ICSU will not be responsible for the accuracy, nature, or quality of information stored on discs, hard drives, or servers; nor for the accuracy, nature, or quality of information gathered through school- provided Internet access. ICSU will not be responsible for personal property used to access ICSU computers or networks or for school-provided Internet access. ICSU will not



be responsible for unauthorized financial obligations resulting from school-provided access to the Internet.

Any violation of ICSU policy and rules may result in loss of school-provided access to the Internet and accounts suspended. Additional disciplinary action may be determined in keeping with existing procedures and practices regarding inappropriate language or behavior. When and where applicable, law enforcement agencies may be involved.

ACCEPTABLE USAGE OF TECHNOLOGY: Secondary Student Expectations: Grades 6-12

As a secondary student at ICSU, I accept that using the school computers and accessing the Internet on iPads, Chromebooks, and mobile device is an educational advantage afforded me by ICSU and that inappropriate use of computers and Internet access may result in my loss of their use and other possible disciplinary action. To help others, and myself, I agree to the following promises:

- I will follow all copyright regulations and will not copy or pirate software. I will not take hardware, software or computer supplies provided by the school.
- I will not attempt to use any software, utilities, proxy servers, mobile hotspots, or other means to access Internet sites or content blocked by the school filters/systems.
- I will not invade the privacy of others or access the network or files of any business, person, or agency with intent to steal, subvert, destroy, or view information that is not appropriate.
- I understand that email is not guaranteed to be private. ICSU has access to all messages and that all Internet activity can be monitored.
- I will not access information that is considered dangerous, illegal, or potentially damaging.
- I will not conduct business transactions or commercial activities on school technology.
- I will not give out school information to anyone online. I will not pretend to be someone else when sending/receiving information.
- I will be polite and use appropriate respectful language on and offline. I will not use vulgarities, harass others, use ethnic or racial slurs, access inappropriate websites, engage in hacking or vandalism, or transmit or view obscene or offensive material on school technology.
- I understand that I am not allowed to download or install any personal software with inappropriate material on school technology.
- I will not degrade or disrupt school or Internet network services or equipment; this includes but is not limited to tampering with computer hardware/software, vandalizing data/computer lab equipment, invoking computer viruses or attempting to access restricted or unauthorized network services.
- I will act maturely in social media relationships with fellow students, teachers, and anyone who is part of our educational environment. Considering these actions and their consequences on the

DETENTION POLICY

Detention is typically a consequence for low-level and mid-level misbehavior. Detentions are served on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 3:15-4:15. Parents will be billed KW 10,000 for a child’s first detention, each detention thereafter will increase by KW 5,000 until the cost is capped at KW 25,000 (10,000, 15,000, 20,000, 25,000) per detention. **Detention is a punishment** and is to be served on the next available detention day. It is not to be served at the convenience of the student or the student’s family. Actions have consequences and students must be taught that their negative actions can and will affect others. Whether the student rides the bus, has a music lesson or other after school event the detention must be served, having a previous commitment will not be a reason to change the day detention. Athletes must serve any detention earned before involvement in a practice or game. Also, participation in other extra-curricular events is not permitted until all detentions are served. **Parents need to fully back up the school when discipline takes place.** Failure to serve the detention will result in another assigned detention in addition to the original detention to be served. Students must return the Rule/Standard Violation form with their parent signature the day of detention or the next day back from a suspension. Failure to return this form will result in a detention. Disrespect or disobedience shown to the detention monitor will result in additional detentions and/or other disciplinary actions.
